Funeral services for Dr. C. C. Ariail, 55, prominent physician and civic leader who died early yesterday morning after being ill for some time, will be this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Mackey mortuary. Services will be conducted by Rev. H. O. Chambers and Rev. J. Owen Smith.

Active pallbearers will be Dr. R. E. Houston, Dr. Joseph Lemire, Roy Bass. Robert Bioshop, Dr. L. W. Boggs and Henry T. Mills. They, with members of the Greenville County Medical society and C. A. Born in Sumter. Dr. Ariail was born in Sumter and was a son of the late Rev. James W. and Caroline Hodges Ariail. His father was for 60 years an active minister in the Methodist denomination. Dr. Ariail was graduated from Wofford college and later received his degree in medicine from the Medical College of South Carolina. For more than 30 years he practices medicine. 27 years of that time in Greenville. During World War I he was commissioned a medical officer in the United States Navy.

He was a member of Buncombe street Methodist church and had served on the board of stewards of the church. He was a member also of the Masonic fraternity, including the Hejaz Temple of the Shrine.

For two terms Dr. Ariail served the Greenville County Medical Society as secretary, and for one term held the office of president. At the time of his death he was completing his second term as president of the Hopewell Tuberculosis association. He was a director of the State Tuberculosis association. Dr. Ariail was vice-president of the Greenville Humane society. He was one of the organizers, six years ago of the Hospital Benefit association of South Carolina and served continuously since that time as secretary of its board of directors. He was president of the staff of St. Francis hospital. An active member of the Greenville Lions club, he had served as the chairman of its sight conservation committee. Dr. Ariail took an active part in cancer control work in this state and two years ago directed the Greenville county drive for funds as well as serving Greenville as a member of the Council of Social agencies.

He was twice married. His first wife was Miss Dorothy Giles, of Graniteville, who died here in 1929. To them were born two children who survive. C. C. Ariail, Jr., and Mrs. M. G. Howle. His second marriage was to Miss Mary Graydon, of Columbia, who survives with two children born to that union, Mary Elizabeth Ariail and Nancy Ariail of Greenville. There is one surviving granddaughter.

Retired Professor Dr. J.M. Ariail Dies---Dr. James Milton Ariail, 92, a retired professor English at Columbia College and Shakespearean scholar, died Friday in the Providence Hospital.

Born in Pacolet, he was a son of the late Rev. James Warren and Carolina Hodges Ariail. He was a member of College Place United Methodist Church, where he was one of the original trustees. He organized and taught the Ariail Sunday School Class for over 35 years. He was an honorary member of the administrative board of the church and was a lay leader for many years.

He received his bachelor's degree from Wofford College in 1905, his master's degree in English from the same college in 1906; a second master's from the University of North Carolina and his PhD from the university in 1925. He received a Doctor of Literature degree from Wofford College in 1945.

During World War II, when there was a shortage of college teachers, Dr. Ariail served simultaneously at Columbia College and the University of South Carolina as a professor of English.

In the late 1930s, he was elevated to the post of Stackhouse Professor Emeritus of English at Columbia College. In 1925, he won the Smith Foundation Prize given by the University of North Carolina for his work in English. In the same year, he was a member of the Phi Phi Beta fraternity. Subsequently, he was made a member of Omicron Delta Kappa fraternity at the University of South Carolina.

He once served as president of the English department of the South Carolina Education Association. He was a former secretary of the faculty of Columbia College, chairman of the Board of Pensions of the S.C. Methodist Conference, and was named "Man of the Year" by the Kappa Sigma fraternity.

He was former secretary for the Methodist Conference Board of Claimants, where he was active in the establishment of a retirement system for ministers of the S.C. conference.

Dr. Ariail was former secretary of the Southern Christian Advocate (now the Methodist Advocate) for many years.

His published works include:

TRIBUTE TO A TEACHER

Each generation of educators produces its own master teachers, but seldom does one teacher extend his mastery over as many generations as did Dr. James Milton Ariail.

Before death claimed him last Friday at the age of 92, the Professor Emeritus of English at Columbia College could look back on an illustrious teaching career, which had its inception when he was graduated from Wofford College in 1905. In the 71 years since then, he added degrees to his name, laurels to his fame, and -- most notably of all -- thousands of students to the roster of those whose love of English literature stemmed from exposure to his instruction.

If we accept the testimony of this legion, and of his professorial colleagues, he enriched countless lives by introducing them to the superb writings of Shakespeare, Milton, Browning, Keats and other luminaries of literature. But his students' memories of those great men were matched by their memories of him -- not only as a teacher, but as a devout Christian whose faith sustained him through personal tragedies which might have crushed a lesser mortal.

Scholar, teacher, and writer himself -- James Milton Ariail left a legacy of academic achievement and tutorial influence, which imbeds his name permanently in the history of South Carolina education.

Julius F. Ariail, 54, Rapides Clerk of Court, dies. Parish Official serving fourth term in office.

Julius F. Ariail, 54, clerk of court of the Ninth Judicial District since his election on January 16, 1928, died in Touro Infirmary at New Orleans at 7:30 o'clock last night, January 27, 1943, after an illness of about one year. At his bedside at the time of his death were his wife, his two sisters, Mrs. Thompson Bruton and Mrs. Heath Petrie, Mr. Petrie and N. K. Vance. The remains were returned to Alexandria in a Kramer Funeral Home ambulance. The funeral procession will leave the Kramer Funeral Home at 2:30 p.m. Friday and will proceed to St. James Episcopal Church where services will be held and from there to Greenwood cemetery were interment will be made.

Mr. Ariail was serving his forth term as clerk of court, having been elected in 1928, 1932, 1936 and 1940. His fourth term would have expired June 1, 1944.

Mr. Ariail, who was born in Alexandria on April 11, 1889, was one of the most outstanding Rapides parish residents of this generation. He always stood for everything that was good and honorable, and was a friend of the poor and the rich alike.

He attended the public schools of Alexandria, Sewanee Military Institute, Louisiana State University and Tulane. He worked as a stenographer for a firm of attorneys in his younger days, then as bookkeeper for the Rapides Drug Company. He was secretary to the late Congressman James B. Aswell for two years, and then was associated with the law firm of Blackman and Overton before entering public life.

Served as Deputy Clerk

Before his election as clerk in 1928 he served as deputy clerk from 1915 to 1921. Then for four years, until 1925, he was assistant tax collector. From 1925 to 1928 Mr. Ariail was in the abstract and title business.

He was the son of the late Julius F. Ariail, well-known attorney, and Jeanette Blackman Ariail, and grandson of the late Judge W.F. Blackman and Ellen Montfort Wells, and the great grandson of General Montfort Wells and Jeanette Dent of Wellswood Plantation.

On December 14, 1916, Mr Ariail was married to Miss Marie Murphy, the daughter of John Murphy and Noemie Wells Murphy, and the granddaughter of the late Governor Madison Wells. They have three sons, Julius F. Ariail, Jr., lately commissioned as a Lieutenant in the United States Army at Camp Wolters, Texas, John and Blackman Ariail.
