With the exception of a brief period in 1882 when he practiced law at Marshall, Texas, Mr. Boggs lived and followed his profession in Pickens from 1881 until 1913. In 1882 he was elected solicitor of the Eighth Judicial circuit, which position he held for eight years, retiring to run for congress. He was the first president of the Pickens railroad and at one time was editor of the Pickens Sentinel and a member of the State Press association. He was a member of the Grand Lodge of Masons, and also was a member of the Knights of Pythias. On December, 24, 1882, he married Miss Minnie Lee Bruce, of Pickens, who preceded him to the grave. Mr. Boggs was an elder of the Presbyterian Church.

Four children survive him. They are Miss Helen Boggs, of Pickens, and Messrs, LeRoy of Cincinnati, Bruce of Los Angeles and Julius E. Boggs of Easley. His two sisters are Mrs. T.H. Smith, of Easley and Mrs. H. I. Horton of Columbia.

The funeral was held Friday afternoon at five o'clock at Pickens. The body left Anderson over the P. & N. lines.

Funeral services were held in the Pickens Presbyterian church and conducted by Rev. Mr. Dodge of Anderson, assisted by Rev. J.C. Bailey and Rev. D.W. Hoitt. The body was laid to rest in the church cemetery by the side of the grave of his wife. Many magnificant and beautiful floral offerings were sent by friends.

Few citizens in the Piedmont section were more popular than Mr. Boggs. During his service as solicitor he had occasion to visit repeatedly the counties of Greenville, Anderson, Pickens and Oconee, which comprised his circuit. He was an orator of unusual ability and when the news got abroad that he was to speak in a case of interest the court rooms were usually packed. His white hair and his face were familiar sights in all the court house cities of his circuit, as well as in other cities and communities. He was often called upon for addresses at social gatherings, and in other ways was in demand. Today when men talk of court house experiences, or of speeches heard within the walls of the temples of justice of the old Eighth circuit, almost invariably some one will recall the speeches which Mr. Boggs made in this or that case. One of his points of strength was his oratory and his ability to pick out the essentials of a case, presenting them in a manner such as was sure to impress the jurors. He often, by forcible presentation of evidence, nerved the jury to the duties imposed upon it.

Robert H. Cureton, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. A.H. Cureton, died at the home of his parents on Vardry street last evening at 7 o'clock.

Several days ago Mr. Cureton came to the city from his present home in Pickens for medical treatment, he being in declining health, and while he was known to be very ill his death came as a shock to his family and friends.

He was a native of this city and was well known as a young man of splendid business ability and was of such a genial and pleasant disposition that he was popular with everyone who knew him.

He has been engaged in the cotton oil mill business for several years and was employed in the mill in this city. Afterwards he became a manager of a mill in Sumter and he then removed to Greenwood and held the same position there for several years. About a year ago he organized and became the manager of a mill at Pickens Court House and has made his home there since.

His wife, who was Miss Mary Blassingame of this city, with five children survive. Mrs. Cureton, who is also quite ill at her home in Pickens, will be unable to attend the funeral of her husband. TAPS ARE SOUNDED FOR FREDETTE TODAY
Death Came Tuesday Night After Four Hopeless Weeks
With Broken Neck, He Was Conscious Almost To The Last

After having lived just a month with a broken neck, Richard Ernest Fredette of Middlebury, a member of Company I. V. N. G., died at the Post hospital at Fort Ethan Allen at 10 o'clock Tuesday night, reiterating almost to the last that his greatest grief was that he could not follow his comrades to the battlefield. In a flag draped coffin in which his body was removed from Burlington to Middlebury on Wednesday evening, he is being buried here today, with funeral services at his home conducted by President Thomas of Middlebury College. A bugler, Musician Nugar of Fort Ethan Allen, was detailed here to sound taps over the grave.

The bearers were: Benjamin Cota, Milton Brown, Denzil Glavin, Thomas Bushway, Thomas Burns and Frank Goss.

Up to within a short time of his death Fredette, although practically all of his body was paralyzed, was conscious and talked with his mother, Mrs. John Fredette, who had been at his bedside most of the time. He had talked a great deal of his comrades and when the

regiment was broken up with the departure of a large portion of it for Massachusetts, he, realizing he would never be able to accompany it was greatly affected.

His case was practically hopeless from the time he entered the hospital with injuries sustained when he dived into shallow water while swimming in Lake Champlain on August 5. At the hospital when it was determined that his neck was broken a delicate operation performed for the removal of part of the vertebra, but the surgeons realized that at best this would only give him a few weeks of life. The paralysis gradually spread and on Sunday he practically lost consciousness.

Fredette, who was the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Fredette, would have reached his 20th birthday the 17th of next month. He enlisted in Company I, of Brattleboro just prior to the departure of the First Vermont for Mexican border service, his brother, Warren Fredette of Brattleboro, being at that time a sergeant in that Company, and since discharged.

He is survived by four brothers and five sisters, in addition to his parents. The brothers being Roland of Drewsville, N.H., Fred and Harry of Westmoreland, N.H., and Warren of Brattleboro. His sisters are Mrs. Arthur Bissette and Miss Eleanor Fredette of Middlebury and Mrs. W.A. Shaw and Mrs. Arthur Grover of Brattleboro.

Military honors were paid by the soldiers at Fort Ethan Allen when Fredette's body was removed, the hearse being surrounded by four guards and conducted along Officers' Row out of the Reservation, accompanied by the Second Cavalry band. While the procession passed down the highway, several hundred medical men who were drilling on the parade ground stood at attention and the National colors were brought to half mast.

Mr. Judd was a member of the Civitan Hospital Board, which owned and operated Hamilton Memorial Hospital until 1951, at which time the Dalton – Whitfield County Hospital Authority was created to operate the hospital. He served as an active trustee of the Hospital Authority until 1956 and has served as a trustee Emeritus since that time.

The Judd Memorial Tumor clinic, at Hamilton Memorial was established in July 1938 by Mr. Judd's mother and Mr. Judd contributed through the years to its operation. Likewise, Mr. Judd, several years ago, established a trust fund to assist in the continuous development of the Judd Memorial Tumor Clinic.
