White Man Killed and Woman Assaulted in Crow Creek Section

The most atrocious crime ever committed in Pickens county occurred at the old Parson's mill place in the Crow Creek section, fourteen miles above Pickens, Monday night, when Floyd McCollums, a Negro killed James Hendricks, a white man, and committed rape upon a woman of Hendricks' home, forcing the woman to remain with him until about daylight Tuesday morning.

The woman informed a neighbor of the occurrence, but Sheriff Roark was not notified until about two o'clock Tuesday afternoon. Upon receipt of the information the sheriff and Policeman Nealey left for the scene of the crime. At this time the body of the dead man had not been found, but, Sheriff Roark found it about 3 o'clock, behind the barn, about thirty yards from Hendricks' home. A hole had been knocked in the left side of his head, probably with a stick.

About 1 o'clock Monday afternoon Hendricks and the Negro went together after some whiskey. Returning with the whiskey, the Negro then went somewhere after a chicken, which he brought back to Hendricks' house, where it was cooked and eaten. After supper, about 10 o'clock, the Negro pretended to see something in the yard, and he and the white man went out to see what it was. That was the last seen of Hendricks alive. The Negro returned to the house alone and forced the woman to remain with him until next morning.

James Hendricks moved from Easley to Crow Creek only a few weeks ago and was not well known in that section, though it was known that his character was not of the best and not much importance was at first attached to the story of his disappearance, this causing the delay in notifying the sheriff. It is said that Hendricks and his wife did not get along together very well.

At this time (Tuesday night) the Negro has not been captured. Officers and several citizens are scouring the country for him. We have been unable to learn the degree of excitement which prevails in the section where the crime was committed. McCollum is not well known in this section.

McCullum, Murderer, Landed in Columbia.

The Pickens Sentinel, Jul. 9, 1914.

Floyd McCullum, the Negro murderer who committed two flendish crimes in the Crow Creek section of Pickens county last week, was captured near Franklin, N.C., Friday morning by Sheriff R.R. Roark and Policeman H.A. Nealey, of Pickens, who were accompanied by Dover Hinkle and Fred Whitmire, of the upper part of the county.

The officers took the prisoner on a branch line railroad from Franklin to Cornelia, Ga., where they changed to the main line and carried the prisoner to Columbia. The people in Pickens knew nothing of the capture until the Negro was out of reach and well on the way to the penitentiary.

The chase for the negro began Tuesday night and was incessant until the capture Friday morning, being conducted with great skill and fortitude. During that time the officers chased the fiend about 135 miles through swamps and mountains and slept but five hours and ate two meals. The Negro had a long start and at times the hunt seemed fruitless, but with courage and determination which you seldom hear of except in novels, the officers pushed on. He had inquired along his route the direction to Asheville, while at the same time he was headed for the Tennessee line. The officers came upon him in what is known as Sugar Fork, ten or fifteen miles from the Tennessee line in North Carolina.

The Negro made no resistance when captured. He denied the crime, but admitted that he was in the neighborhood of the dead man's home on Monday night. He is known by the names of Floyd McCullum, Alex McLain and Clate Humphrey.

A reward of \$300 had been offered for the capture of the Negro, Sheriff Roark offering to pay \$50 and Gov. Blease \$250. It is likely that the reward offered by the governor will be divided between Sheriff Roark and Chief Nealey. Pickens county was greatly stirred by the murder of Hendrix and a lynching could hardly have been averted had the Negro been brought to the Pickens jail.

The Sentinel last week carried an account of the crimes, which occurred Monday night in the Crow Creek section. McCullum killed James Hendrix, a white man, and criminally assaulted a white woman in the same section. It was Tuesday afternoon before the sheriff heard of the crimes.

The verdict of the coroner's jury was that "James Hendrix came to his death caused by some blunt instrument believed to have been in the hands of one Floyd McCullum."

(Note: Floyd McCullum was found guilty of the crimes and died in the Electric Chair.)

Shooting Fatal To Both Men.*

**HAD BEEN HAVING TROUBLE OVER LAND RENTALS;
NO EYE-WITNESSES TO FRAY.**

Just Like Days In Early West, They Met And Both Began Firing; Local Officers Investigate But Are Holding

No One In Connection With Affair.

Lewis Bessem, 37, and Otto Clark, 28, are dead at Chelsea as the result of a shooting affray which occurred at the farm of Bill Dye, near Wingtonon school house between Chelsea and Talala, Friday evening.

It is said that the men had been having trouble for several months over the rental of lands.

According to officers, Bessem, who is known to many Claremore and Inola, people, pointed a gun at C. Clark, Otto Clark's father several days ago, after a heated argument. They were separated by friends.

The men, both armed, met at the Dye farm Friday night and although they were no eye witnesses to the tragedy, both men are believed to have begun firing immediately.

Clark is said to have fired four shots, all of which entered Bessem's body. The latter fired five times, four of his bullets taking effect.

Both men were dead before medical attention could be summoned. Clark is survived by a wife and four children, besides his parents. Bessman is reports as "not married," though he was once married to Faye Lauthers, an Inola girl, and lived there for a while. They later separated. She re-married and he came back and administered a flogging to his successor to her affections, who promptly left the country.

County Attorney Dennis Bushyhead and Sheriff Faulkner, with Deputy Hurt Flippin, hastened to the scene of the trouble and questioned a farmer giving his name as Joe Smithy, with whom Bessman lived; also Coty Wallace, said to be the owner of the gun used by one of the dead men was questioned. Neither of these men were held.

Dye, who is an industrious farmer of the Wingtonon district is in no way connected with the tragedy, which unfortunately occurred at his farm. The principals merely happened to meet there, and there the tragedy occurred.

Several phone calls were made by the Claremore Progress in an effort to get more of the details of this shooting, which were unfruitful.

Funeral arrangements for Clark and Bessman have not been announced as yet.

G., died at the Post hospital at Fort Ethan Allen at 10 o'clock Tuesday night, reiterating almost to the last that his greatest grief was that he could not follow his comrades to the battlefield. In a flag draped coffin in which his body was removed from Burlington to Middlebury on Wednesday evening, he is being buried here today, with funeral services at his home conducted by President Thomas of Middlebury College. A bugler, Musician Nugar of Fort Ethan Allen, was detailed here to sound taps over the grave.

The bearers were: Benjamin Cota, Milton Brown, Denzil Glavin, Thomas Bushway, Thomas Burns and Frank Goss.

Up to within a short time of his death Fredette, although practically all of his body was paralyzed, was conscious and talked with his mother, Mrs. John Fredette, who had been at his bedside most of the time. He had talked a great deal of his comrades and when the regiment was broken up with the departure of a large portion of it for Massachusetts, he, realizing he would never be able to accompany it was greatly affected.

His case was practically hopeless from the time he entered the hospital with injuries sustained when he dived into shallow water while swimming in Lake Champlain on August 5. At the hospital when it was determined that his neck was broken a delicate operation performed for the removal of part of the vertebra, but the surgeons realized that at best this would only give him a few weeks of life. The paralysis gradually spread and on Sunday he practically lost consciousness.

Fredette, who was the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Fredette, would have reached his 20th birthday the 17th of next month. He enlisted in Company I, of Brattleboro just prior to the departure of the First Vermont for Mexican border service, his brother,

Warren Fredette of Brattleboro, being at that time a sergeant in that Company, and since discharged.

He is survived by four brothers and five sisters, in addition to his parents. The brothers being Roland of Drewsville, N.H., Fred and Harry of Westmoreland, N.H., and Warren of Brattleboro. His sisters are Mrs. Arthur Bisette and Miss Eleanor Fredette of Middlebury and Mrs. W.A. Shaw and Mrs. Arthur Grover of Brattleboro.

Military honors were paid by the soldiers at Fort Ethan Allen when Fredette's body was removed, the hearse being surrounded by four guards and conducted along Officers' Row out of the Reservation, accompanied by the Second Cavalry band. While the procession passed down the highway, several hundred medical men who were drilling on the parade ground stood at attention and the National colors were brought to half-mast.

A pioneer resident of Wisconsin passed away at 8:15 o'clock Sunday morning, when Jos. Oryall breathed his last at the home of his son, Frank C. Oryall, 602 Briggs street. The gentleman had been gradually failing for several months, but was able to be about at all times, and a week ago last Friday he attended the funeral of the late Mrs. Wm. Leonard, Sr. The day was very cold and stormy, and Mr. Oryall caught a severe cold. He failed quite rapidly from this time and a few days later took to his bed. During the last three days of his sickness, he was in an unconscious condition and his death came very peacefully.

Mr. Oryall was a native of Canada, born of French parents, near Quebec, 84 years ago the 2nd of last April. While still a young man he came across the line to New York State and married there. John Harvey Ariail, Jr., a Northern Virginia attorney, businessman and real estate developer, philanthropist and avid outdoorsman, died Thursday, January 20 at age 68 at Inova Fairfax Hospital, due to heart failure.

John Ariail was born in Greenville, S.C., in 1942, son of John H. and Virginia Simpson Ariail. He received a B.A. from Davidson College in North Carolina and graduated from the Law School of the University of Virginia, where he received his L.L.B. in 1967. Mr. Ariail served as a captain in the U.S. [Army](#) before being stationed with the CIA in Salzburg, Austria. Mr. Ariail was also a member of the Arlington County Bar Association and served as president of that organization. With law partner W. Mr. Ariail developed many family real estate ventures with B.M. Smith & Associates, Inc., including the ongoing development at the Penrose Square complex on Columbia Pike in Arlington. Mr. Ariail will be remembered as a loyal and generous supporter of diverse organizations.
